Congress vs. President

- Overrides Veto
- Approves or rejects president's budget
- Ratifies treaties (Senate)
 - Approves or rejects president's cabinet nominations, ambassadors, and others.
- Investigates and reorganizes executive departments
- May impeach the president

Congress vs. Supreme Court

- Proposes constitutional amendments to override rulings
 - Changes size of Supreme Court and numbers of lower federal courts
 - Approves or rejects Supreme Court nominees
 - May impeach federal judges

President vs. Congress

- Veto laws
- Orders special sessions
 Exerts political pressures
 Appeals directly to citizens

President to Supreme Court

- Nominates Supreme Court justices and federal judges
 - Pardons those convicted under federal laws
- May refuse to enforce federal court orders

Supreme Court to Congress

Rules on constitutionality and legality of laws passed by Congress and signed by the president

Supreme Court to President

- May rule the actions of the president or others in the executive branch unconstitutional or illegal
- Interprets treaties signed by president
